Controlling access to secure In-Flight Supplies
Once supplies have been made secure, access must be controlled.
Common ways of controlling access to secure supplies are shown here.

Caged areas	Locked storage	CCTV	Pass control

Caged areas, and locked storage provide physical security. CCTV is used to monitor the supplies and passes are used to control access.

Component identification
Firearms are more difficult to detect, firearms may be broken down into their components that can be hidden more easily.
Components that cannot be broken down any smaller and can be recognised as firearm parts.
